Curriculum Overview # 1

Year 1 Autumn Term 2022 (Sept-Oct)



English

Read write inc

The children will review and recap sets one, two and three. They will have streamed classes to focus on their sounds and read the phonic story books accordingly.

Reading

The children will explore two books about their body parts and their senses- (Funky Bones and Sparks in the Sky). The children will explore and write about the setting, character and narrative of the stories. They will also sequence and comprehend the story in detail to answer questions about it and learn if it is fiction or non-fiction.

Handwriting

The children will begin to form upper and lower case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place.

Grammar

The children will develop their understanding of vocabulary and punctuation. They will learn basic grammar knowledge like nouns, adjectives, verbs, pro-nouns and common exception words.

Home Challenges:

Home challenges will relate to the topics taken, 'All about me'. We will also include spelling words, grammar and Maths worksheets to aid the children with their learning. The children will also do projects for Science and World studies to explore their creativity and answer questions linking to them.

Science

In Science the children will learn to identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which parts of the body are associated with which sense. Children will learn to recognise what different basic parts of the body do and why they are important. Children will also begin to work scientifically and learn to ask simple questions and recognise that they can be answered in different ways. Children will use their observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions.

World Studies

In World Studies, children will learn where they are from. They will explore famous landmarks of Egypt, its culture, food and know what the capital city is. Children will learn about the United Kingdom and its location, the capital of the country and important landmarks of London, like Big Ben, Buckingham palace and London eye.

SEAL

New Beginnings:

This theme focuses on developing children's knowledge, understanding and skills in four key aspects of social and emotional aspects of learning: empathy, self-awareness, social skills and motivation. The theme offers children the opportunity to see themselves as valued individuals within a community, and to contribute to shaping a welcoming, safe and fair learning community for all. Throughout the theme children explore feelings of happiness and excitement, sadness, anxiety and fearfulness, while learning (and putting into practice) shared models for 'calming down' and 'problem solving'.

Maths

In Maths, the children will learn all about number and place value
Number:

Number & Place Value

- count to and across 20 forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number
- Count, read and write numbers to 20 in numerals
- Given a number, identify one more and one less
- identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least
- read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words

Number: Addition & Subtraction

- read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs
- represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20
- add and subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20, including zero
- solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and missing number problems such as $7 = \square - 9$.

Physical Education: The children will learn all about football games, it teaches coordination, increase bone strength and cognitive brain function. They will practice dribbling, passing and shooting and also play matches.

ICT: The children will learn about the online safety to know how to be safe while using the internet.

Music: The children will learn to identify the difference of dynamics in the sound while singing and dancing. They will also identify a beat while using their bodies and use percussion instruments.

Art: The children will practice learning basic motor skills of using a pencil and scissors to aid towards their motor skills. They will also learn how to draw a self-portrait, and make other crafts.
